# **Chair Updates**

## Public Policy October 2015

This past month, Virginia AAUW Public Policy continued working on its Get Out the Vote (GOTV) campaign aiming to register 500 new voters by June 2016 and another 500 by November 2016. National Voter Registration Day was September 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2015 and AAUW members around the country helped towards raise awareness regarding barriers that still exist concerning registration and voting. In Pennsylvania, an online voter registration system was created this year, Oregon began automatic voter registration during driver's license renewal, and in Vermont a same-day voter registration program has been established. New measures such as these around the country are expected to add thousands of more voters. AAUW members continue to advocate for the Paycheck Fairness Act at the federal level, fighting to enact legislation to help women and families end pay discrimination.

Take a look at the Fall 2015 AAUW Report: The Simple Truth about the Gender Pay Gap. The U.S. Department of Labor released data mid-September showing little change in the persistent pay gap. In Virginia, median earnings for men were \$52, 864 compared to \$42, 445 for women in 2014. This is an earnings ratio of just 80 percent, or 23<sup>rd</sup> out of all states and the District of Columbia. Although Virginia has some equal pay protections, there is still much work that needs to be done.


