Dear Members,

For the first time in history, we may elect our first woman US President in a couple of months. Yet, there is not the feeling of excitement that prevailed in the country in 2008 when we elected our first black President. No matter how you feel about the candidates or who you vote for it is important that you vote - women fought long and hard for that right and we must exercise it.

We want to thank all of our members who volunteered to help Leslie and Lane with Get Out The Vote at NOVA. We are very proud to have so many of you help people register to vote at eight different sessions.

Our next speaker Dr. Larry Korb will discuss new aspects of this upcoming election as he talks about "Election and Foreign Policy" on Thursday, October 13, from 7 to 8:30PM. You should have received a flyer on this. If not, please let us know.

Our first event this year was the MEET AND GREET reception, which had a number of guests as well as about 20 members attend. Caroline Pickens enthralled us with stories of women leaders and events in the history of AAUW, showing all the progress we have made over the years. We are eager to have some new groups created, so again, please let us know what you would like to do since it is YOUR AAUW Branch.

Also, as you know, two of our organization's national concerns are the barriers and biases that women of leadership face in many areas, including the wage gap and pay equity. Although the gap has narrowed since the passage of the Equal Pay Act in 1963, the average women still takes home only 80 percent of men's median earnings. Congresswoman Eleanor Holmes Norton (D-DC) recently introduced a bill, "Pay Equity for All Act" and the City of Alexandria is taking major strides towards this goal. We are very pleased to see the good work promoted by our City Council in Alexandria.

We hope you will support efforts to bring pay equity to everyone in the workforce.

There are several events planned in October beyond our regular program, including the Northern Virginia District Meeting in Burke, VA on "Gender Bias in Politics" and our cultural event, the Alexandria Ghost Tour in Old Town. # Foreign Policy Issues and Election 2016: More Light Than Heat

Historians will be studying this presidential election for years to come, but we each have a choice to make SOON. Let's get the facts about world events that we need to make an informed choice in November. Dr. Larry Korb will discuss the foreign policy positions of the candidates with time for your questions.

Lawrence J. Korb is a Senior Fellow at the Center for American Progress. He is also a senior advisor to the Center for Defense Information and an adjunct professor at Georgetown University. Prior to joining American Progress, he was a senior fellow and director of national security studies at the Council on Foreign Relations. From July 1998 to October 2002 he was council vice president, director of studies, and holder of the Maurice Greenberg Chair.

Prior to joining the Council, Dr. Korb served as director of the Center for Public Policy Education and senior fellow in the Foreign Policy Studies Program at the Brookings Institution; dean of the Graduate School of Public and International Affairs at the University of Pittsburgh; vice president of corporate operations at the Raytheon Company; and director of defense studies at the American Enterprise Institute. He was an Assistant Secretary of Defense from 1981 to 1985.

Dr. Korb has authored, co-authored, edited, or contributed to more than 20 books and written more than 100 articles on national security issues. Please join us in welcoming Dr. Korb to get perspective on foreign policy issues in our current election process.
