"Learning about 18th-Century Women's Lives through Ledgers"

Women in the 18th century are most often thought of in the context of their husbands, fathers, brothers, or owners, for enslaved women. However, to get a glimpse of women's independence, the use of store ledgers reveals much about their daily lives separate from men: What did they buy? When did they shop? How did they pay for their purchases? What were their professions? For whom did they make purchases? What connections did they have in the community? This presentation will attempt to answer these questions and more in a look at both free and enslaved women living in the Alexandria area in the 1760s.





The Virginia General Assembly will meet in Regular Session in Richmond from January 10-March 10, 2018. Ellen looks forward to getting to know members of the Alexandria Branch of the AAUW and volunteering at some of their many


