

Public Policy

AAUW State Lobby Day

AAUW members met with local delegates and senators and with Governor Ralph Northam and with Lieutenant Governor Justin Fairfax.

As reported by the Springfield Annandale branch, Leslie Tourigny, Vice President for Public Policy, and with AAUW members, urged support for equal pay legislation, ratification of the ERA, fair, non-partisan redistricting, paid sick leave, and measures to assist victims of human trafficking, especially minors.

Leslie also briefed the Governor on the recent successful effort in Massachusetts to institute Work Smart training for state employees and suggested Virginia look into this.

Although legislative proposals supporting AAUW priorities failed to advance this year, the proliferation of bills on these issues and the enthusiasm of the many new delegates offer grounds for optimism in the future.

Changing the Climate for Women and Girls

April 20-22, 2018

Portsmouth Renaissance Hotel

Location, Location, Location! The Renaissance Hotel sits on the Elizabeth River flowing between Portsmouth and Norfolk. Two easy blocks away is the downtown area with shops, restaurants and museums. A quick ferry ride gets you to Norfolk. All AAUW members for whom AAUW has an email address received an important email on February 22 from the National Board of Directors. The email presented three very important proposed AAUW Bylaws amendments that you will vote on this spring. Because of the timing, NOW UNTIL MARCH 22 is when you can (a) comment on the proposals, (b) amend them, and/or (c) propose you own amendment to anything in the AAUW Bylaws.

The proposed amendments are these:

1. Change the structure of the national board to staggered three-year terms, which begin with elections in 2019 (the primary reason for voting this year on amendments is to put this in place)

2. Delete the requirement that national board members must be AAUW members; the board composition of 15 must have at least 10 AAUW members so no more than five can be non-members. Non-members could serve in all board positions, including board chair.

3. Delete the degree requirement and open membership to all who support our mission. The information on the website has a thorough explanation of the rationale for each of the proposed amendments.

As members, it is really important to review the proposed amendments, comment or amend as you wish, consider if there are other places in the AAUW Bylaws where you want to submit an amendment, and then VOTE between April 25 and June 9 (May 21 for paper ballots). If you submit an amendment, be sure to follow the instructions carefully. If you comment on a proposed amendment,

simply type your comment into the "Comment" box. How do you find the amendments? Click on the link to the AAUW website in the second paragraph of the email and then click on the yellow book that says "Bylaws."

Did you miss or delete the email? All is not lost. Just go to <u>www.aauw.org</u> and click on "National Bylaws Amendment VOTE" on the home page.
