HUMAN TRAFFICKING AWARENESS MONTH PROGRAM: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT HUMAN TRAFFICKING

On Sunday, January 26, 2020, Ms. Diane Schrier and Dr. Elizabeth Hendrix led a human trafficking awareness presentation moderated by Dr. Gail Kalin at Cameron Station Club House. Diane first spoke about the business model of human trafficking and how different groups exploited people. She then described victim profiles, stories about human trafficking survivors and how they were seduced and exploited, the various types of trafficking, techniques to detect victims and how to report the information. She also discussed Virginia statistics and status, national and international problems and approaches.

Elizabeth reported the branch's three-pronged approach to work on this public policy priority, which involves: educational awareness, advocacy, and research and development. She updated the group on their progress with the AAUW Community Action grant application for the Angel App, a new rescue tool, as well as their hope to have an annual

online conference to feature the app. Elizabeth also gave the group current, Virginia House and Senate bills pertaining to human trafficking and asked them to write their legislators in support of these bills.

Ms. Lalitha Mani provided a model advocacy letter with the current bills that people could use to send to their legislators to aid human trafficking victims. She and Dr. Dev Mani also worked at the advocacy table during the presentation and helped people identify their legislators and how to contact them. Free cards, envelopes, and stamps were provided by the branch human trafficking intervention team members (Deborah Mcghee and Elizabeth Hendrix).

It was a successful team effort. On Saturday, February 22, 2020, Diane and Elizabeth gave this presentation to the Springfield-Annandale AAUW branch.

He mentioned that he would be holding a press conference that afternoon, which turned out to be putting the capital under emergency conditions for the gun rally. He talked with us about guns, fair pay, human trafficking and many other things. He was very interested in the Equal Pay Day Proclamation.

We delivered information on the gender pay gap to nearly 70 lawmakers. I met with four aides or administrative assistance, except for Mark Levine who was able to talk with us. It was very exciting to watch the House of Delegates and then the Senate pass the ERA.. After standing on a very long line to get into the House gallery, where the governor's wife and daughter were, we went to the overflow rooms. The view was excellent and we could hear all of the arguments. There were huge cheers when each Chamber passed the ERA.

A MESSAGE FROM VA CO-PRESIDENTS

Hi All:

Back in September 2019 Governor Ralph Northam appointed Dr. Janice Underwood as Virginia's first-ever Director of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion. In fact, she is the country's first cabinet-level diversity officer.
