





PUBLIC POLICY

Crossover Tuesday took place on February 7, 2023. That is the date when any bill must pass from it's originating chamber to the corresponding chamber for consideration. Several bills of concern to the AAUA-VA were either not voted on in their respective chambers or were defeated in the corresponding chamber. Primary among these were bills restricting access to abortion and bills that would have diverted funds from public education to various savings accounts plans. SB1101 Paid family and medical program passed the Senate but the corresponding House Bill, HB 2035 died in committee. On a brighter note HB 1895 which prohibits employers from requiring current and prospective employees to sign NDAs that would prohibit such employees from disclosing a sexual assault also passed in the Senate.

Both Chambers are currently working on reconciling their respective budget bills prior to the February 25th deadline. One key element of that process will be how the General Assembly will fund the gap in education funding caused by the miscalculation of the impact of the Governor's repeal of the State portion of the sales tax.



DIVERSITY BOOK GROUP

Fourteen women in the Diversity Book Group met virtually on February 13 to discuss <u>Refugee High: Coming of Age in America</u> by Elly Fishman. Ms. Fishman, a Chicago journalist, was inspired to explore the lives of refugee adolescents at a local public school, Sullivan High, following the Muslim Ban on immigrants in 2017 and the precarious situation of most foreign born people living in the US during the last administration.

Participants enjoyed the book, getting an intimate view of the lives of four particular students from different corners of the globe as they wrestled with landing in a dramatically new life. As intriguing for many were the mini portraits of those who staff the English Language Learner program and those within the school—like the principal—and in the community who support it. The conversation was a lively and rich one. Several members shared their experiences as immigrants, teachers, and a high school PTA President and reflected on how evocative the read was for them.
