Come join us on Saturday, May 20, 2023, 10:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. for the Alexandria Celebrates Women (ACW), Women's History Tour, guided by ACW Co-Founder and Vice President Gayle E. Converse. ACW is a volunteer 501(c)(3) charitable non-profit organization that recognizes the accomplishments and contributions of Alexandria's women of the past, present and future.

Arrive at the Meeting Spot at the Alexandria Visitor Center at 221 King Street by 10:20 a.m. Public parking is located at City Hall, 301 King Street, directly across from the tour starting point, as well as on adjoining streets. Restrooms are available at City Hall and in the Visitor Center.

ACW's tour follows "a walking route through historic Old Town Alexandria and will stop by many of the sites associated with a wide array of diverse and courageous women who have been an integral part of Alexandria's history. One stop will be at the site of the former federal courthouse in Alexandria where in 1917 the suffragists arrested for picketing in Washington, DC and imprisoned in the DC Workhouse in Occoquan, were tried and released. The Alexandria Branch received a mini-grant from AAUW-VA to contribute to the historic marker at this site. Another stop on the tour is the Kate Waller Barrett Branch of the Alexandria Library, site of the 1939 sit-in.

Because space is limited, advance registration is required no later than May 7. Sign Up Here.

ACW suggests comfortable walking shoes; face mask, if preferred; hand sanitizer; water; sunscreen; hat; umbrella (as the weather dictates); and dressing in layers.

Food: Please let me know the dessert that you will be donating. So far, we have chocolate brownies and mini cupcakes. I will be bringing the non-alcoholic beverages.



DIVERSITY BOOK GROUP



Reading a relatively current NYT best seller is a first for the Diversity Book Group. In March we discussed <u>Crying in H Mart</u> by Michelle Zauner, 34, whose memoir was published in 2021 and spent 66 weeks on the prestigious list. Ms. Zauner had previously been known in creative circles as an accomplished Indie rock star in the band, Japanese Breakfast. It was a curious name for the Korean born young woman who emigrated to the US at one and was raised by her Korean mother and American father in a rural part of Eugene, Oregon.

The book is a homage to Ms. Zauner's mother, who died of cancer when her only child was 25. It explores in depth this not so unique mother-daughter relationship and all the emotions we experience following the death of a loved one. For these reasons and others, most discussants thought it deserved the popularity it has garnered. While the focus is on the author's search for her cultural heritage and its impact on her family life, these and other themes struck many members as universal.

An important portion of the book is devoted to Ms. Zauner's obsession with the mastery of Korean cuisine. It is a necessary piece of her story as she sought to use it to bond with her mother and as a means to achieve her mother's approval. It became a profound way to also bond with her Korean heritage following her mother's death. All book group members were glad they read <u>Crying in H Mart</u> even if only a few remarked that they "loved it."

December 14 - Elections in Latin America-The rise of left-wing governments in Latin America (facilitated by Peter Kent)





Many believe that Fairfax libraries were open to everyone since their founding in 1939, but the authors' research found a hodgepodge of local rules that effectively barred Black users, not only in Fairfax but also in Loudoun and other counties.
